

CONTRACT LAW: LEGALITY Mr. Como Business Law

- I. Legality: the sixth and final requirement of a contract that states that an agreement must have a legal purpose.
 - A. Contracts are illegal if their purpose or manner in which they are carried out illegal, violates a statute, or is contrary to public policy.
 - *This varies in different states because state legislature of each state decide on the statutes, and public policy (healh, safety, general welfare) of the individual state
 - 1. <u>Agreements that Violate Statutes</u>: These agreements are illegal and void because they violate individual state statutes such as;
 - a. Civil and Criminal Statutes -
 - b. Usury Statutes
 - c. Gambling Statutes
 - d. Sunday Statutes
 - e. Licensing Statutes
 - 2. Agreements Contrary to Public Policy An agreement that requires the performance of an act harmful to the public benefit.
 - a. Agreements in Unreasonable Restraint of trade
 - 1. Contracts not to compete
 - 2. Price fixing
 - 3. Competitive bidding
 - b. Agreements to obstruct instice
 - c. Agreements interfering with marriage
